



<p>29. Carmenere La Joya Gran Reserva – Chile (D) Carmenere is Chile’s flagship grape variety and has been mistaken for Merlot with its smooth style and plummy flavours. It has notes of sweet spice and will age well.</p>			£24.00
<p>30. Chianti Classico Gabbiano - Italy (C) Grown in the Tuscan hills this Chianti Classico is soft and packed with red cherry notes and a complexity from ageing. It’s definitely time to rediscover this all-time classic.</p>			£25.00
<p>31. Fleurie La Bonne Damme - France (B) Stylish wine from Beaujolais, this is one of the best expressions of Gamay with a ripe raspberry flavour and a floral undertone.</p>			£29.00
<p>32. Rioja Crianza Solar Viejo - Spain (C) Relatively full on the nose, with the opening aromas of vanilla and cinnamon. On the palate, the entry is smooth, with well integrated tannins. This is well aged Rioja showing a beautifully classic style.</p>			£25.00
<p>33. Torre Del Falasco Valpolicella Ripasso, Cantina –Italy (D) These grapes are raisened before pressing giving it an incredible density. On the palate the wine comes across rich and fruity with a dry, lingering finish. A baby Amarone.</p>			£29.00
<p>34. Chateauneuf Du Pape Cuvee De L’Hospice – France (E) An expressive bouquet of red fruits on the nose. Ample palate with a great structure and generous and complex characteristics of this famous appellation.</p> <p> Commended at Sommelier Wine Awards</p>			£35.00

35. **Pouilly Fumé, Château Favray, Loire Valley, France** £45
The mature vineyards of Château Favray sit in an enviable position, south-facing, sun-filled and with a hillside location high above the River. This is quintessential Pouilly in a fresh, open and relatively fruit-forward style. Not just a grassy, acidic dry white but a round, lush wine with depth of fruit and fantastic concentration which make it an ideal sauvignon blanc.
36. **Pouilly Fuisse, Domaine des Maillettes Grand Reserve, Burgundy France** £55
This is a dense full-bodied white Burgundy. A powerful wine, with an intense palate of ripe fruit and vanilla notes and balancing acidity, leading to a long complex finish. Guy Saumaize, a second generation producer has 13 hectares of mostly Chardonnay. Specific selection based on the terroir allow Guy to make expressive wines of true depth and quality.
37. **Chablis 1er Cru `Les Vaudevey`, Laroche, Burgundy, France** £60
Vaudevey is a 35 hectare Premier Cru which sits to the west of the town of Chablis. The steep slopes rest on classic Kimmeridgean soil; sun exposure on the south facing vines, occurs in the morning and early afternoon, which gives good ripeness and an elegance not always found in the more powerful of the Premier Crus.
38. **Puligny Montrachet, Ropiteau, Burgundy, France** £80
Puligny-Montrachet is a village on the Côte de Beaune, located in the area producing the finest white wines of Burgundy. The vines are located in the plain with a South-eastern exposure which protect them from the North wind and is ideal to gather the most amount of sunlight and ensure a good concentration.
39. **Meursault Les Perrières, Domaine Jean-Michel Gaunoux, Burgundy, France** £100
Jean-Michel Gaunoux has brought extraordinary energy and drive to the seven-hectare estate he took over in 1990. Michel's wines are classically rich and opulent with fresh balancing acidity. Generous toasted almond nose with overtones of honey. Full bodied and very complex in the mid palate with a silky buttery oak and a clean, mineral finish.

40. **Barolo di Serralunga d'Alba DOCG, Fontanafredda, Italy** £55
Blood red with ruby highlights, it has a clear-cut, intense nose with overtones of vanilla, spices, withered roses and underbrush. The palate is dry, but soft, full bodied, velvety and well balanced, and is engagingly complex throughout the lengthy finish.
41. **Gevrey-Chambertin, Domaine Lucien Boillot, France** £60
In 1950 Lucien Boillot transplanted to Gevrey-Chambertin. Since 2003 his son Pierre has overseen the family's seven-hectare domaine: His wines convey a sense of lightness and minerality while offering no shortage of flavour. On the palate one can find a balanced acidity, integrated oak, modest tannins and cocoa powder, coffee, mushroom.
42. **Chateau D'Arsac, Margaux, Bordeaux** £75
Chateau d'Arsac is one of the older properties in the Medoc as it has a history dating back almost 1,000 years to the 12th century. Phillipe Raoux's visionary outlook sought him to create a solid alliance between wine, vines and living art. He endeavours continuously to make Château d'Arsac a permanent expression of linking modernity with tradition and is one of the finest in Margaux.
43. **Chateau Bellevue, St Emilion, Bordeaux** £90
2% of the vines are devoted to Cabernet Franc and the rest is Merlot. The terroir has clay and limestone soils. The vines are on average, 40 years of age. Chateau Bellevue is one of the oldest vineyards in the Right Bank and is one of the purest expressions with an incredible concentration and length of flavour.
